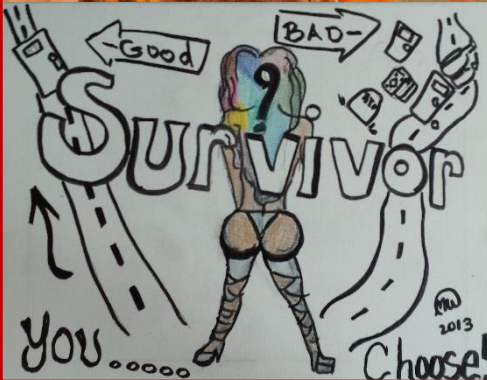




2014 Annual Report

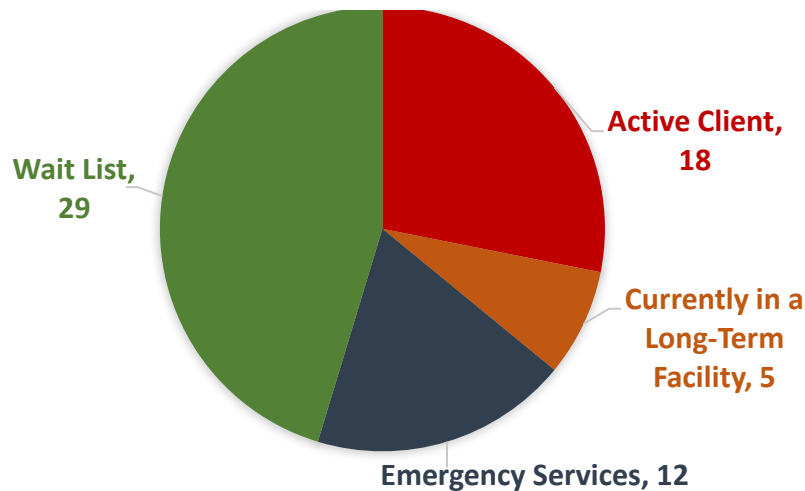

calls on our for-survivor-by-survivor hotline.

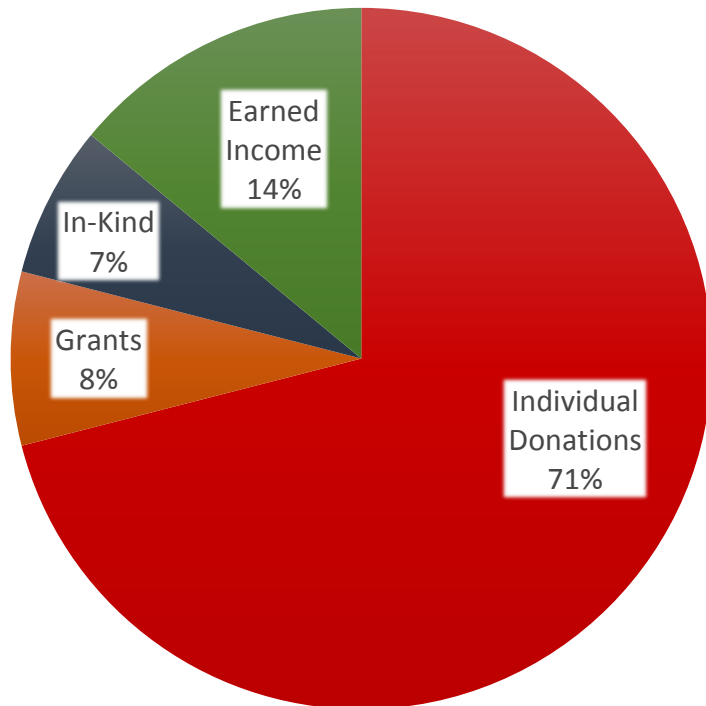
Did you know?

Courtney's House provides **30 days of emergency services** to any survivor of sex trafficking, regardless of location or age.

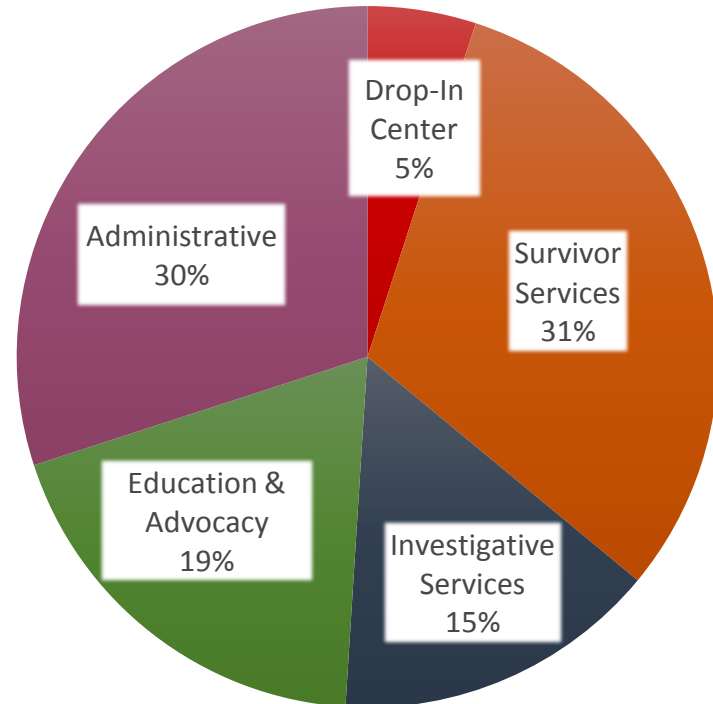
Financials

Tiffany is a 19 year old autistic survivor. She has struggled with drugs, alcohol, and mental health issues in the past. In 2014, Tiffany worked hard to stay on her meds, to attend Narcotics Anonymous meetings, and to build positive relationships. She has now started community college!

The survivors' names have been changed for confidentiality purposes.

Destiny is a 17 year old survivor. In the past, she has frequently run away, has been arrested, and has challenging mental health issues. In 2014, Destiny has worked hard to make positive change in her life. She has taken control of her mental health. Her relationship with her parents has improved dramatically, and she is no longer in trouble with the law. She is holding down a full-time job at a restaurant!
